International dimension of Erasmus+ 2021-2027 (I)

- Mixed funding of Int'l dimension of E+: E+ budget line (H2) and External financial instruments (H6)
- Heading 6: 2.174 billion EUR (1.932 billion EUR 2014-2020):
 - IPA III (WB, 374 million EUR)
 - NDICI (rest of the world, 1,8 billion EUR)
- Slight difference in the composition of the regions compared to 2014-2020
 - New regions
 - Mix of High income countries (HICs) and Least developed countries (LDCs)







ICM in the new Erasmus+ programme: budget (II)

2022 ICM Budget for ES NA



- Increased budgets of 4 763 065 EUR for Sub-Saharan Africa and 3 317 344 EUR for Western Balkans
- Smallest regional envelopes will contain between 110.000-180.000 EUR for Pacific, Middle East and Caribbean regions.



ICM in the new Erasmus+ programme: application form

• New application form – regional approach:

NEW

- 3 quality questions: one at project level (Project design and cooperation arrangements) and two for each region the applicant intends to cooperate with (Relevance, Impact & dissemination)
 - Shift funds between countries in the same region => more flexible budget management
 - Apply only for student/staff mobility without specifying types of activity (studies/ traineeships or teaching/training)
 - Estimation of participants with fewer opportunities



International Credit Mobility (ICM) in the new Erasmus+ programme: inclusion

Enhanced opportunities with a focus on inclusion:

- **NEW** Short blended mobilities
 - Opening up to recent graduates for traineeships
 - Flexible format for doctoral candidates
 - Top-ups for participants with fewer opportunities
 - Special inclusion support for individuals and institutions





Organisational support

EUR 500/participant

Individual support



EUR 700-900/month for students and EUR 140-180/day for staff

EUR 70/day up to the 14th day of activity and EUR 50/day from 15th to the 30th day of activity in case of blended mobility



Contribution to travel costs

EUR 20-1500, depending on distance travelled



ICM in the new Erasmus+ programme: geographical targets and restrictions (I)

- Priorities and indicative geographical targets different regions to be attained at European level over the whole duration of the programme
- Restrictions for outgoing short, 1st and 2nd cycle students affect certain countries in almost all regions covered under NDICI (Western Balkans – Region 1 under IPA III is exempted)
